Jewellery

Children should not wear jewellery to school. The only acceptable items of jewellery are a wristwatch (not novelty ones!) and earring studs. Should a pupil have pierced ears, plain studs should only be worn and in order to comply with health and safety regulations, must be removed or covered with a plaster during all PE activities. Please note that the school will be unable to take any responsibility for any jewellery that is lost.

Hair & Make Up

We recommend that hair should be neat and tidy and worn with no extremes of style or colour. Long hair should be tied back during the school day. No make-up or nail varnish is to be worn to school.

### **Important Information**

### Before & After School

I am sure that you will have noticed how busy/congested the playground is at the beginning and end of the school day? It would be really helpful if parents could avoid congregating around the gate area as it is difficult to get in and out. Plus at the end of the school day, bus children line up at the gate and it is sometimes very difficult to see who is or isn't in the line!

It would also be helpful if parents could keep the area outside the classroom of the future and the path down to the playground clear. This will enable children who have been dropped off to see a clear pathway down onto the yard and the teacher on duty where they are. We would like to encourage all children to come onto the yard as soon as they come into school. Children who wait with their parents/grandparents should not be going between their parents and the yard. Parents/grandparents should only be responsible for their child. Parents should not be using the school car park when collecting children from after school clubs. Just a reminder - dogs are not allowed on school premises.

### Reception Class Outdoor Area

As you know children in Reception Class and Year 1 are collected from the Reception Class Outdoor Area at the front of the school at the end of the school day as this is most practical. Can I please ask that parents with younger siblings are respectful of this area? This is Reception Class' outdoor classroom and outdoor learning is an important part of the Early Years curriculum. We have had several items broken and damaged since September and the cost to repair and replace is expensive. Younger siblings should not be using or playing on any of the equipment whilst waiting to collect brothers/sisters. Please note that the gate will not be opened before 3.15p.m.

### **Parking**

We have had meetings with the local police and members of Durham County Council and there are plans in place to try and alleviate some of the problems. We have been asked to collect registration plates of cars that park on the no parking zone outside school. The police are calling into school to collect the numbers we have recorded and the dates on which they were recorded.

#### Water Bottles

Hopefully over the coming weeks we will see the sun shine! Please can you make sure your child has a water bottle in school and has a sun hat/cap. Please note that only water is allowed. It would also be useful if sunscreen was applied at home. Water Bottles are available to purchase in school at a cost of £1.00 each. Please enquire at the school office.

### Mobile Phones

An increasing number of children are bringing mobile phones into school. We do have a strict policy regarding this. We appreciate that if children are walking home unaccompanied or get the school bus, then for safety reasons they might need to have their phones. Any phones brought to school must be handed in at the office and they will be kept in a safe place until the end of the day when it is your child's responsibility to come and collect it.

### School Bags

We are limited to space in our porch areas and an increasing number of children are bringing huge bags to school and it is difficult for us to store them. Could we please ask that your child brings a school book bag and a drawstring type bag for P.E./After School Club kit.

Children are also bringing pencil cases that are so full that they are too big to fit in their trays! School do provide children with all the necessary stationary. We appreciate that some children like to bring pens, pencils etc from home, but can this please be kept to a minimum. It also causes unnecessary upset when items brought from home go missing.

### School Uniform reminders:

School uniform is important in building our children's sense of identity and belonging to our school community. It also instils a sense of pride and supports positive behaviour.

We require all pupils to wear school uniform which consists of:

Navy Blue sweatshirt/jumper or cardigan (with or without the school logo on) sky blue or white polo shirt (with or without the school logo on) Grey or black trousers Grey, navy or black skirt Black, navy blue or brown, flat sensible, safe, shoes or trainers (with no markings) Black, navy blue or brown, flat boots as a winter option.

Sandals with socks (no open toes please)
Gingham dresses -blue
Any cap to protect from the sun (School Trends do a one with school logo)

### PE Kit

White T-Shirt or Polo Shirt
Plain black or navy shorts or leggings
Plimsolls For indoor PE - bare feet.
Trainers for outdoor games only
Tracksuit bottoms/sweatshirt for outdoor games
