Curriculum Focus of PPG Spending 2011-12

To support pupils at Escomb Primary School Pupil Premium Funding was targeted at:

- Raising attainment and improving rates of progress in Reading, Writing and Maths.
- Developing emotional well-being, social skills and behaviour of pupils.

How the funding was spent 2011-12

- To increase Teaching Assistant time to ensure personalised learning for children and to increase intervention support for reading, writing and maths to consolidate learning and challenge.
- To foster a love of reading through use of Volunteer Reading Support Scheme thus increasing progress and attainment.
- To subscribe to Mathletics for school and home use.
- To enhance the curriculum; contributing towards the cost of educational visits to ensure equality of opportunity.

Measuring the impact of PPG Funding 2011-12

- At Key Stage 2 pupils eligible for FSM attained standards above similar pupils nationally and in line with all pupils, particularly in reading. Pupils eligible for FSM make significantly better progress than similar pupils and all pupils nationally.
- At Key Stage 1 Pupils eligible for FSM attained standards well above similar pupils and all pupils nationally in reading, writing and maths. Progress was also good.
- Positive feedback received from parents and children about use of Mathletics to engage and support maths learning at home. Parents reported that children enjoy the challenge and competitive element.
- Pupil confidence and self-esteem increased through range of targeted support and enrichment activities and visits.
